## Physician Training Requirements

Phase II Training utilizes a **blended learning approach** that combines web-based training and classroom training activities. The training curriculum was developed using a combination of industry best practices, lessons learned from Phase I, and input from training professionals and BayCare's physician informaticists.

### Non-ED Physicians

#### Training starts week of Aug. 10

- Required to take an average of less than 2 hours of self-guided, web-based training (WBT), which can be completed at their own pace
- Morton Plant North Bay also will offer WBT sessions at a hospital classroom with an on-site facilitator for assistance

### ED Physicians

#### Training starts week of Aug. 10

- Required to take an average of 4 – 5 hours of self-guided web-based training (WBT), which can be completed at their own pace
- Also required to take 8 hours of classroom training, which consists of a 4-hour training called "A Day In the Life" and a 4-hour work session on PowerNote ED (*WBT must be completed prior to taking classroom training*)

#### P H A S E I I S U P P O R T & B E N E F I T S

During and after Activation, physicians will have access to the following support: dedicated physician service desk, facility-based educators/clinical physician support analysts, and physician informaticists. During Activation, physicians also will have access to additional resources, such as the Light House (command center) for assistance, physician SuperUsers, and at-the-elbow (one-on-one) support.

In Phase II, clinicians will document right into BEACON, creating real-time access to information that physicians need. Real-time communication and care team coordination leads to a more complete picture of patients' needs and provides more tools to better enable all of us to continue delivering national, best-practice care.
